

His longform reporting and essays have appeared in *The New York Times*, *Harper's Magazine*, *The New Republic*, *The California Sunday Magazine*, and *Jacobin*, among other publications. He received his PhD in cultural anthropology from Duke University and was a Mellon Research Fellow

in the Society of Fellows in the Humanities at Columbia University. He lives in Atlanta with his family.
